#### **Greening the Riverfront: Pillsbury A Mill Tour**

Tuesday, July 6, 6:30 pm

**Note: This tour will begin at the East Bank Mills Sales and Design Center, 333 Main Street S.E.**

Visit the historic Pillsbury A Mill and hear about plans for its redevelopment in the first of a walking tour series highlighting sustainability projects on the Minneapolis riverfront.

The Pillsbury A Mill was the largest flour mill in the world when it was completed in 1881 and operated as a flour mill until the fall of 2003. Participants will tour the historic complex with Kit Richardson and David Frank of Schafer Richardson, who will highlight the ways that historic preservation is a green practice. They will also discuss the proposed East Bank Energy Center, a plan to use hydrothermal heating and cooling in the project with water flowing in historic waterpower raceways. This program was made possible by a grant from the Saint Anthony Falls Heritage Board and is presented in partnership with Schafer Richardson. Fee: \$8 adults, \$6 senior citizens, \$4 ages 6-17 and MHS members. Reservations required; call 612-341-7555.
