Prairie Lightning: The Rise and Fall of William Drew Washburn

Please join senior representatives from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of the Interior, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Council on Environmental Quality and the U.S. Department of Defense for a public listening session and discussions in Minnesota on conservation, recreation and reconnecting people to the outdoors. This past April, at the White House Conference on America's Great Outdoors, President Obama signed a memorandum establishing the America's Great Outdoors Initiative

to develop a conservation agenda worthy of the 21st century and to reconnect Americans with our great outdoors. The President understands that protecting and restoring the lands and waters that we love and reconnecting people to the outdoors must happen at the local level. Therefore, President Obama directed the principal leaders of the America's Great Outdoors Initiative to travel across the country to listen and learn from people directly involved in finding grassroots solutions to conserve our lands, waterways, historical and cultural resources and reconnect Americans to the outdoors. The President indicated that the sessions should engage the full range of interested groups, including tribal leaders, farmers and ranchers, sportsmen, community park groups, foresters, youth groups, businesspeople, educators, State and local governments, recreation and conservation groups and others. This listening session in Minnesota offers an opportunity for us to engage in a conversation about the solutions you and your community have created to address the challenges and opportunities facing land and water conservation; for engaging people in outdoor activities; and in restoring and conserving our vital natural and cultural resources. The public listening session and discussions on August 4 will provide an opportunity for the leaders of the America's Great Outdoors Initiative to hear from you and other voices in the region about solutions for building a 21st century conservation and recreation agenda and for reconnecting people with the outdoors. Water pollution comes from many different sources, including our everyday activities. How we care for our yards and grounds, wash and maintain our cars and even dispose of pet waste can contribute to water pollution in the Mississippi River. The hard surfaces of our driveways, sidewalks and pathways increase the amount of stormwater entering the storm drains. There are many choices we can make to reduce these harmful impacts on water quality. Become a partner organization with the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) by applying for a Stewardship Fund grant to work together to improve water quality in the MWMO. The MWMO includes parts of Minneapolis, Saint Paul, the City of Saint Anthony Village and Lauderdale. Projects funded through the Stewardship Fund Program should achieve the following: 1) improve water quality or improve water and natural resource management, and/or 2) build community understanding, knowledge and initiative related to water and natural resource issues and solutions. Over \$200,000 is available through three types of grants:

- Mini Grants up to \$2,000 – March, June, and September cycles each year
- Planning Grants up to \$10,000 – September annual cycle
- Action Grants up to \$50,000 – September annual cycle

Nonprofit organizations, officially recognized neighborhood groups, schools, local units of government and business and professional associations are eligible to apply. Individuals, homeowners' associations and condominium associations, and private businesses may partner with eligible applicants in order to apply.
